TOWN CENTER GROUND BREAKING!

On August 16, Strongsville marked a historic moment as Mayor Tom Perciak and local officials broke ground on the Town Center Enhancement and Walkability Initiative. This transformative project aims to boost accessibility and recreational offerings in the heart of the city, benefiting families, employees, and visitors alike.

The 81-acre Town Center, which attracts over a million annual visitors for events like Homecoming and the Winter Wonderland Lighting Celebration, will see significant

upgrades. Planned improvements include an interactive fountain, an all-inclusive playground, sports courts, a food truck area, and a pavilion. Enhanced walkways, trails, and signage will improve connectivity, while a new roundabout will enhance traffic safety.

The project, decades in the making, is funded by grants from Cuyahoga County, the State of Ohio, and NOPEC, alongside donations from local businesses and civic groups. Contributions are still being accepted, with naming rights available.

“This initiative represents years of collaboration and planning to enhance the quality of life for our community,” said Mayor Perciak.
