### TOWN CENTER PARK NOW OPEN!

The new Town Center Park officially opened on October 2 with a ribbon-cutting ceremony, followed by an afternoon filled with family-friendly activities.

The park, completed in just one year, offers a variety of amenities, including an enclosed pavilion, an inclusive playground with equipment for children of all abilities, a splash pad, courts for tennis, pickleball, and sand volleyball, a half basketball court, a designated food truck area, and ample



green space for community events. New walkways and sidewalks enhance pedestrian access throughout the Town Center area.

Funding for the project came primarily from grants provided by Cuyahoga County, the state of Ohio, and NOPEC, with additional contributions from local businesses, civic groups, and individual donors. Major donors were honored during a luncheon prior to the ribbon-cutting, where a donor wall in the pavilion was unveiled.

Three sponsors contributed significantly enough to earn naming rights: the Brunswick Auto Mart/Medina Auto Mall Pavilion, the Strongsville City Club Playground, and the Robert "Bob" Hric Sports Courts. The park is conveniently located next to the Recreation and Senior Center at 18100 Royalton Road.
